Family Service Center provides comprehensive mental health services to youth, adults, and families facing trauma, challenges, and systematic barriers to care. With offices in Texas City, Galveston, and Baytown, the FSC service area extends throughout Galveston, Liberty, Chambers, Brazoria, Fort Bend, and Southern Harris counties. Through school and community-based care, FSC integrates clinicians within campuses, healthcare facilities, and partner organizations to ensure fast crisis response, long-term case management, and trauma-informed support. Services of FSC include individual and family counseling, parenting skills programs, and specialized initiatives for veterans, young parents, and individuals re-entering family life after incarceration.

With programs supporting underserved populations, FSC also provides specialized services for teens in schools, domestic violence survivors, and individuals with chronic stress or disease. FSC collaborates with local agencies to expand access to care, addressing systematic barriers that

prevent underserved populations from receiving the mental health support they need. By focusing on early intervention and family-centered care, FS creates sustainable impacts that go beyond short-term counseling, ensuring lasting well-being for the communities they serve.
