### **What To know About Clear Lake City Water Authority**

In their endeavor to provide needed services, support a healthy environment, and protect Clear Lake residents and properties, the CLCWA focuses on delivering superior water quality, timely maintenance, repair, and updates for a resilient infrastructure. The CLCWA prioritizes the quality of Clear Lake’s health and homes including environmental protection, flood mitigation, and educational support. In addition, the CLCWA works with partners to turn a detention pond into a thriving recreation area, restore natural habitat, and improve stormwater filtration.

The CLCWA is situated almost entirely in southeast Harris County in the Clear Lake area, about 20 miles southeast of downtown Houston. Its northwest to southeast boundary is State Highway 3. Their service area surrounds the NASA Johnson Space Center on three sides. Since the creation of CLCWA, 13,490 acres have been developed for commercial, residential, and public recreational use, making it the largest water district in the State of Texas.
